The primary goal of the program is to maximize the environmental, social, and economic (triple bottom line) impact of GCCW by supporting the growth of the local industry and the advancement of innovation. The program has flourished in membership, programming, staffing, and funding under Anna's leadership.

proven her effectiveness by growing the GSI Partner program into a thriving global model for local, sustainable economic development.
